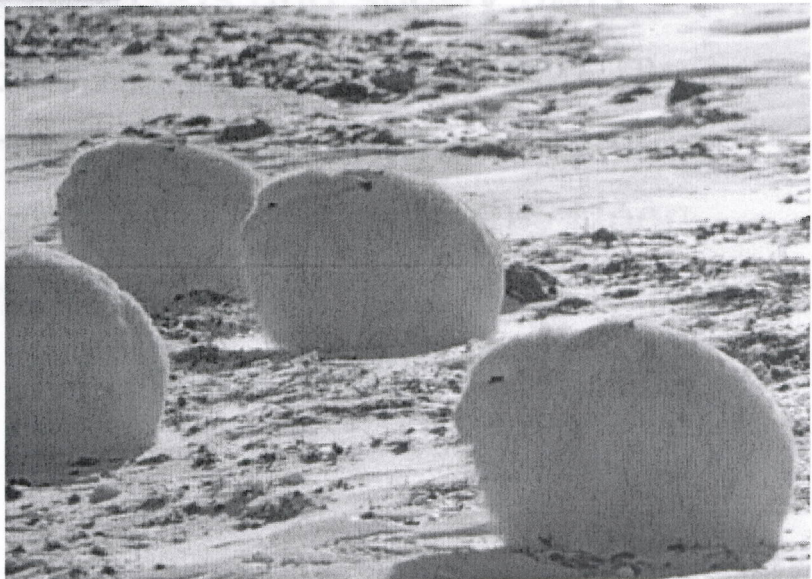
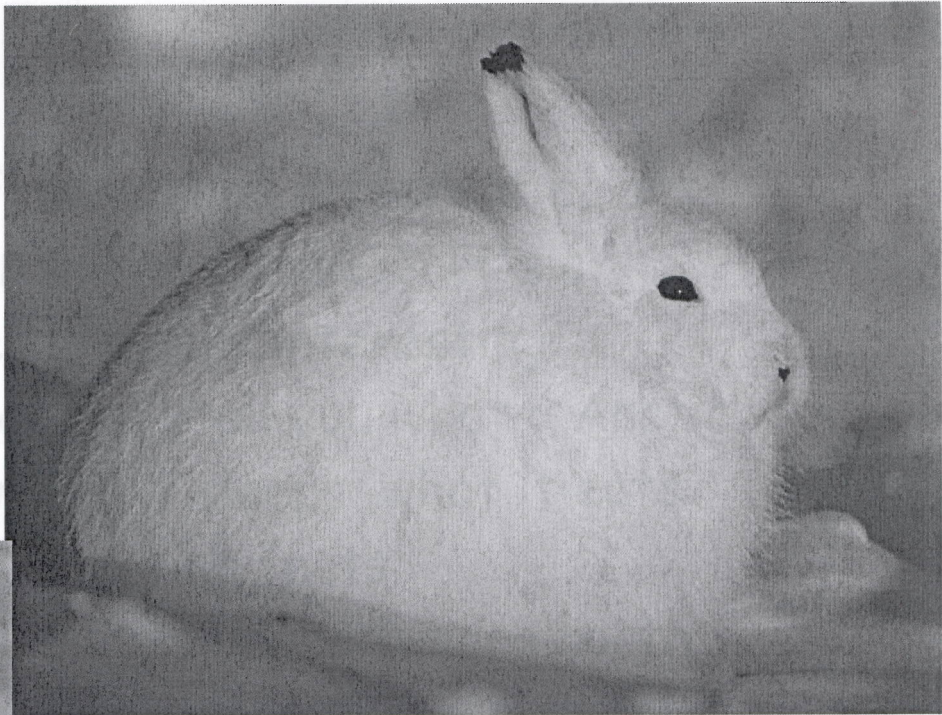


Arctic Hares
